In some applications, a processor transmits information to another device over a first communication link. In order for the processor to be assured that the information was correctly transmitted, a method known as return-to-zero (RTZ) signaling may be used. In RTZ signaling, a logic 1 is transmitted by the transmitter over the first communication link at a selected moment and is received by the receiver at a later time. During transmission, the selected moment is represented by a time code. The time code is typically an n-bit time code, where n is a number in the range of 5-20, or may be another system clock, such as the global positioning satellite (GPS) clock. However, the n-bit time code is not a primary, reliable time code. Because of the limited resolution of the n-bit time code, RTZ signaling requires several time-consuming handshakes, so that the receiver is able to ascertain with a high degree of confidence that the 1 was actually transmitted. A further complication is that the time code is transmitted at a low frequency, such as, for example, once every 50 milliseconds. In view of the foregoing, there is a need for improved methods, systems, and media for providing reliable transmission of information via RTZ signaling.
